

### THE MEANING OF ASH WEDNESDAY 4:30pm Mass at St. Boniface

- 1. Ashes were used as a sign of repentance in the Old Testament.
- 2. Ashes are a public sign of our intent to die to our worldly desires and live in Christ.
- 3. Ashes also symbolize grief, in this case, grief for our sins.
- 4. As our foreheads are being marked, the Priest says: "Remember that you are dust and unto dust you shall return, or Repent and believe in the Gospel."
- 5. The Ashes come from the blessed palms used in the Palm Sunday celebration of the previous years.



Suffering is something that affects everyone. For many, it can be a stumbling block to faith in God and the catalyst to an unhappy life. But it doesn't have to be this way.

In fact, it can be the catalyst to something greater: union with Christ.

In Real Suffering, Dr. Schuchts examines the complex nature of suffering based on his personal experience and decades of encounters as a family and marriage therapist. Dissecting physical pain (with Jesus as our model), emotional loss (through the intercession of Our Lady of Sorrows), and spiritual guilt (with St. Peter as our example), he shows the underlying purpose of our sorrows and helps us to see how they can be a means of drawing closer to God revealed.



**Stations of the Cross** — sometimes called Way of the Cross — is a popular Lenten devotion that has very ancient roots. It was prayed by early Christian communities, especially in the fourth century, when the Roman Empire began to recognize Christianity. Oftentimes, people would make a pilgrimage to Jerusalem to retrace Jesus' steps from his arrest in the Garden of Gethsemane to being forced to carry the cross to the crucifixion site at Golgotha.

Those who could not visit Jerusalem would use the community's churches and other buildings as "stations" that represented each stage of what happened to Jesus between his trial and his entombment. Groups would travel from station to station, remembering and praying at each one. The devotion gained even more popularity because it was prayed in the vernacular rather than in Latin, and people could understand what was going on.

When praying Stations of the Cross in church, either the entire assembly or just a small group of people move from station to station. The devotion begins with an opening prayer, usually at the foot of the altar. The song "Stabat Mater," or its tune set to different lyrics, is played. During the first part of the song, people move to the first station, where some sort of reverent gesture, such as genuflection, is made and a responsorial phrase is recited. The name of the station is announced, a reference to Scripture is read, and people kneel and say a prayer. This is done at all 14 stations, and then the procession returns to the altar for a closing prayer. Join us Fridays at 6pm at St. Boniface!



If we wish to serve God and love our neighbor well, we must manifest our joy in the service we render to Him and them. Let us open wide our hearts. It is joy which invites us. Press forward and fear nothing.


